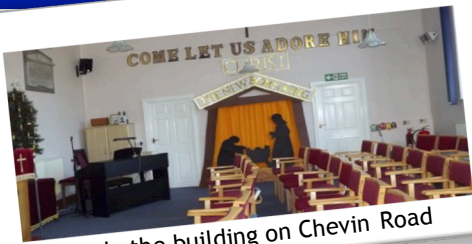

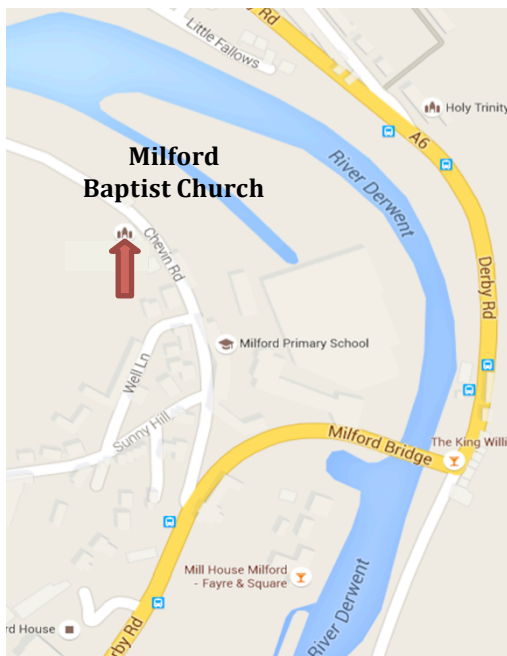
Inside the building on Chevin Road
