

Well – it's Wool!



Last month the church displayed a colourful selection of some beautiful pictures forming part of Milford's May Day Festival.

A small team of skilled 'dressers' from Milford Baptist Church produced one of four traditional

wells using the theme 'HenryV' to celebrate 400 years of Shakespeare.

The other pictures were not so traditional in their method but had an equally stunning effect.

Derek Palmer put on a display of wool art, which illustrated well-known scenes from London and popular Bible stories.

Derek was 14 years old when he started traditional well dressing and developed his skill for wool art when asked by a company in London to produce a well dressing for a theatre production.

The problem is that under hot lights flower petals don't last very long.

He suggested that using seeds and wool could achieve a similar effect - and that's when it all began.

Better known for his recreation of famous buildings in Derby he buys his wood from B&Q, sketches the outline of the picture in pencil, lays out some glue and builds the picture using black wool.

The picture is then filled out using small strands of coloured wool. Rather than a paint and brush, cocktail sticks and scissors are more useful.

Modestly, Derek suggests it's easier than well dressing because you do not have to handle delicate petals.

He worked all his life for Derby City Council as a superintendent for highways and sewers, before becoming responsible for demolishing some of the buildings he now recreates through his pictures.

Many who visited the exhibition enjoyed the display.

When you experience a tragedy through loss, diagnosis of illness or for another reason, there are no words or answers that can take away your grief.


Someone once said at these times God doesn't give an explanation, he gives you the Incarnation.


